It is an inherited disorder of copper accumulation and toxicity, affecting one in 40,000 people worldwide. After basic coverage

of Wilson's disease, Dr. Brewer devotes an entire chapter to answering some of the most commonly asked questions about copper. Many of these questions are unrelated to Wilson's disease, but are questions frequently asked by other types of patients as they are informed that there is "something wrong with their copper."
